## **Storyline Course**

• Is there an easy way to take a game in LMS and take course and make web-accessible item with all elements built in? (Multiple characters and interactions) | Discussion:

- o If talking Articulate Rise, the process is fairly seamless and you can import a Storyline Project into a Rise course
- o In Storyline, there is a "Publish to Web" feature that might be helpful as well.
- Additional option to publish as FTP and this creates a folder structure that can then be uploaded to the web.
- Keep in mind, website wasn't trackable and had to have groups sign waivers that the training was completed.

# Which Development Tools

- Which tools is best to spend time in as diving into Instructional Design? | Discussion:
  - Articulate Rise (easiest learning curve with basic functionality) is great for ease with focus primarily on Text, Videos, and some interaction. Articulate Storyline is typically the most common for with a slight learning curve (an advanced PowerPoint feel) yet allows for complex interaction capabilities. Articulate has a great free community to learn: <a href="https://community.articulate.com/">https://community.articulate.com/</a>;

    - Storyline's new modern player is more responsive but limited to just black or white players.
  - o Captivate is another option that has a slight learning curve with some complex interaction capabilities.
  - Lectora is typically the most complex (larger learning curve) but you can do just about anything. Kevin's
    personal experience is Lectora fixes a few things with their upgrades but breaks one in the process
    typically.
  - o Other tools: Canva, Vyond, Camtasia; Piktochart; Mentimeter; WeVideo
- Installing Fonts into Articulate Rise
  - o People have had experience with installing Google Fonts

When a SME gives you a giant book of content and want's a 15 minute elearning, where do you start?

- Mind Map; Outline; Objectives; always start with the end in mind
  - Mind map is better on flipcharts or whiteboards compared to electronic as electronic has limited space and studies show it has at times limited ideas compared to flipcharts or whiteboards.
- What does the learner actually need to know? Karen also often takes the existing training to get a feel for what is actually currently being given.
